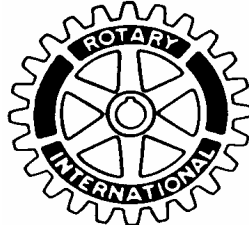

Bob Cerwin and Jim Lofton will also receive this recognition. Mr. Arnn discussed Rotary International's theme for 2001/2002 "Mankind is our Business" and how RI President Rick King chose this passage from Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol" to demonstrate commitment to humanitarian efforts.

He discussed membership recruitment; international projects such as polio eradication; and, enhancing public awareness of Rotary's projects. District Governor Arnn concluded his remarks by clipping a newspaper page into the Rotary Symbol—reminding us of the importance of unity and service. The Club gave him a standing ovation.

President Wilson Hayman thanked District Governor Arnn and our guests and announced next week's speaker, Cy Young of Radio One, and adjourned the meeting.
