The May 14, 2002 meeting of the Rotary Club of Raleigh was called to order by **President Wilson Hayman** who led a moment of silence as the invocation. **Hugh Campbell** led the Pledge of Allegiance and introduced visitors and guests.

President Wilson thanked the over 130 Rotarians and guests who came to last week's Spring Fundraiser/Social at *Exploris*. Over 50 items were auctioned, wonderful food and fellowship were enjoyed and everyone took a tour of the "World's Greatest Places" at the IMAX theater.

PROGRAM

Liz Fentress introduced our guest speaker, **A.P. Carlton**, whom she has known since 1989 when the N. C. Community Foundation began with A.P. as general counsel. Liz told us of his long and distinguished career in the legal profession, civic and community service and that A. P. was a charter member of Crabtree Rotary Club. A.P. is a partner in the firm of Kilpatrick Stockton and currently serving as National President of the American Bar Association, only the second North Carolinian to do so (**Willis Smith, Sr.** was the first). A. P. dedicated his remarks to the memory of **Harry Gatten**, his first real boss and the person who encouraged him in Rotary and to be active in his profession. A. P.

support. He noted the ABA is 125 years old, has 410,000 members and is the only professional membership organization that is increasing in number. The ABA is non-partisan and non-political and policies are governed by a representative 535 member House of Delegates. Each year the ABA advocates for 2-3 dozen issues in Congress and is very active on the Hill with their agenda. A.P.'s interesting talk covered legal ethics, quality and independence of the judicial system, judicial appointments, diversity, access to legal services and assisting developing democracies in the 3rd World. A.P. concluded with a question and answer session.

President Wilson thanked our speaker, visitors and guests and adjourned the meeting with Rotary International's 2001/2002 Theme - "*Mankind is our Business*".
